## **Blythe Valley ringing report 2015**



2015 was the third year of ringing at Blythe Valley. A total of 679 birds - 465 new and 214 re-traps of 24 species were handled during the year. Numbers were down due to a combination of holidays in June/July and poor weather in November and December, when no ringing at all was possible. A total of 13 visits totalling 219 volunteering hours were carried out, plus the monitoring of nest boxes, which had a very successful season.

Ringing is usually undertaken at weekends, as most of the volunteer ringers work during the week. The biggest problem has been the windy weather, which has been an unwelcome feature for most of the year, particularly in the final quarter. Unlike at other sites, there are few sheltered areas at Blythe where we can ring when the forecast is poor. Once wind speeds exceed 10mph, we struggle to ring (and cannot ring in wet weather).

Ringing almost always commences at sunrise, and continues for as long is productive, using mist nests of various sizes.

Supplementary feeding continues throughout the year, with a combination of sunflower hearts, fat cakes, niger seed and peanuts provided. Feeding stations are regularly moved to help record bird populations around the site.

Ringing was only possible during 7 months in 2015 for reasons already mentioned. We may have to review whether it would be possible/practical for the ringing group to ring at Blythe in the absence of Leigh & Tony (Kelly), subject to usual BTO licence restrictions, holiday periods and mid-week ringing, when weekend forecasts are unsuitable.

In addition to the above totals, we received recovery details for a Sedge Warbler ringed at Blythe in 2012 and recaptured 26km away by Wychavon ringing group. Whilst on the surface this doesn't appear to be a particularly impressive journey, this species winters in tropical and southern Africa, so has completed this return journey at least 4 times, as it was ringed by us as an adult in 2012.

## Age codes

- 1 Pulli ringed in nest
- 2 Fully grown, year of hatching unknown (including current year)
- 3 Definitely hatched during current calendar year (e.g. first-years in autumn)
- **3J\*** Passerines only definitely hatched this calendar year and still partly or completely in juvenile body plumage\*
- 4 Hatched before current calendar year exact year unknown (e.g. many adults in autumn)
- **5** Definitely hatched during previous calendar year (e.g. first-years in early spring)
- 6 Hatched before last calendar year exact year unknown (e.g. many adults in spring)

From the above table, we can be confident any bird ringed as a 3J has probably fledged from a nest on site. Because of the lack of ringing during the summer, breeding adults will be under-recorded on site, identified either by plumage/moult presence of a brood patch (generally females only) - these are listed in Fig 4 (below).
